## Exhibit 2

Declaration of William Frick

I William Frick state the following as truth, to the best of my knowledge and ability, under penalty of perjury pursuant to the laws of the State of Washington.

I am the attorney for Jagjit Singh and his family.

I have been licensed to practice law in Pennsylvania since 1992 and Washington State since 1997 My practice has focused on U.S. immigration law since 1996.

During my time as a practicing attorney I have attended several hundred agency interviews and administrative court appearances.

During this time, I do not recall missing a scheduled interview date or Immigration Court appearance.

On May 10, 2010 Jagjit Singh and his family were scheduled for an Individual Hearing on Jagjit's asylum application.

I instructed Jagjit that the hearing had been postponed due to my understanding that Judge Walsh would be working at the Tacoma Immigration Court on that date.

I believed that the hearing had been rescheduled based upon a telephone conversation or voicemail from the Immigration Court that occurred on May 2, May 3, or May 4<sup>th</sup>, 2017, approximately one week before the hearing.

I informed Jagjit Singh and his family that the hearing would be rescheduled.

Mr. Singh telephoned me on Friday May 4 to inform me that the Executive Office of Immigration Review's telephonic information line still indicated that the hearing date was May 10, 2017.

My experience has been that immigration agency databases are not always correct. I told Jagjit this, and told him that I would check with the Court to make sure the hearing had been postponed.

On Monday May 8, I called the Immigration Court and, after explaining the reason I was calling, my call was directed to Judge Walsh's chambers. I left a detailed voicemail message with the Court, explaining that I had been informed that the hearing was being continued, and explaining that I now had agreed not to reschedule another hearing in Superior Court for Chelan County, located in Wenatchee, Washington. That hearing was scheduled for 1:00 on May 10. I believe that I asked the Court to return my call.

The next day, on May 9, 2017 I was in Immigration Court for a Master Hearing before Judge Walsh.

While I was in Court, I asked Tracy, Judge Walsh's Clerk, if she received my voicemail from the day before. Tracy told me that she had, and that the hearing was being rescheduled about a year out, and that we would receive a notice in the mail.

Although we did not specifically state Jagjit Singh's name or A number, I reasonably believed that Tracy and I were communicating about Jagjit's hearing.

After speaking with Tracy I called my client and conveyed to him that the hearing would be rescheduled for a date about a year away.

I now think that we must have both been mixed up about which case we were communicating about. My office did receive a notice a few days later, rescheduling another client's hearing.

During the past six weeks my office has had an unusual number of hearings rescheduled by the Seattle Immigration Court.

I now believe that I misunderstood the Court's communication, despite my attempts to clarify whether the hearing was rescheduled.

Had I not reasonably believed that my clients' hearing for May 10 had been rescheduled, I would have notified the Superior Court for Chelan County of the conflict and requested a continuance from that Court.

On May 15 my office received copies of the Court's orders of removal in absentia for Mr. Jagjit Singh and his family.

Since receiving the orders, I have sought further communication from the Court by leaving a voicemail and I have notified DHS Counsel of this misunderstanding.

I have also attempted to gather written evidence regarding the phone call or voicemail from the Court that led to my misunderstanding. I receive many voicemails and delete them after I listen to them to allow room for new voicemails.

I am attaching a copy of a letter to T-Mobile that explains why I am not presently able to provide call detail regarding the phone communications on May-2-4 with the Court.

The Court usually calls me on phone number 206 286 0167. This number is forwarded to a cell phone that I use, and per T-Mobile's call-detail limitation, the company cannot provide the number of an incoming call, when a call is forwarded.

I am attaching copies of phone records indicating my calls to the Immigration Court and a copy of the hearing scheduled in Wenatchee on May 10, that I did attend.

Additionally, I am attaching a copy of a letter from Dr. Jan Zemplyni, indicating that during the week of May 8, my family was involved in a difficult medical situation that caused me concern. My wife underwent surgery to correct scarring from an injury and suffered a difficult recovery. Although Christine's medical condition that week was not directly a cause of my misunderstanding the Court's communications, as I second guess this significant mistake, I realize that I was distracted by her medical status, which was an extremely unusual event.

Any miscommunication or misunderstanding occurred through no fault of Mr. Singh or his family members.

In preparation for the May 10, hearing my office submitted filings requesting an interpreter for the hearing, and notifying the Court of our clients' change of address. We filed these in mid-March 2017.


My clients were still collecting evidence that we were to submit on their behalf up until May 2, and my office was ready to file our Pre-Hearing Statement on May 4. We did not do so based upon my understanding and true belief that the May 10 hearing had been rescheduled.

The miscommunication occurred despite my honest effort on May 8 and May 9 to clarify whether the hearing had been rescheduled.

I spoke with Judge Walsh's Clerk again on May 23, 2017 during a Master Hearing for another client and she indicated that she had received my voicemails and that she did remember our communication in Immigration Court on May 9, 2017.

I am sincerely sorry for my apparent misunderstanding of the Court's communications. This is something that has not happened during hundreds of appearances over more than two decades. It is concerning to me and I will work to prevent this kind of misunderstanding from ever reoccurring.

**I am trying to show the identity of a telephone number that called to my number between May 2-4, 2017.**

**My T-Mobile number is call-forwarded to 206 979 3514. The call detail available to me does not show the phone number that called me. It only shows the number that the call was forwarded to.**

**In other words, the only call detail available for calls made to my number, when my number is forwarded, is the number that my phone is forwarded to, not the number that has placed the call to my T-Mobile number.**

**In the past few days I've had some conversations with T-Mobile employees who tell me that this is the only call detail available. T-Mobile employees have been as helpful as can be, and have looked through documents to find something that states this "limitation" on call-forwarding records, but we have not been able to find any written information describing this fact.**

**Because I would like to show that I received a call from a certain number sometime between May 2-4, 2017 – but am unable to provide the call detail – I have asked T-Mobile to send me an email just stating that call detail showing the number that places a call, is unavailable in T-Mobile records when my phone number is in call-forwarding mode.**

Christine suffers from a heart condition known as supra-ventricular tachycardia, which can lead to unpredictable, fast heart rhythms. Because of Christine's tachycardia we are more careful and watchful during her recovery.

Mr. Frick has elected to maintain a careful monitoring of Christine's condition while she is recovering at their home. She has not tolerated her pain medication as well as I would have expected, but her recovery and ability to care for herself fully can be expected within three to four days following her surgery.

I am very supportive of William's efforts in monitoring and taking care of Christine during this period.

## Exhibit 3

Declaration of Jagjit Singh

I Jagjit Singh, state the following as truth, to the best of my knowledge and ability, under penalty of perjury pursuant to the laws of the State of Washington.

1. I am an applicant for asylum in the United States, based up threats and injuries that were inflicted on me in India. My wife, Ravinder Kaur, and my children, Amardip Kaur and Hargun Kaur are derivative applicants, included in my application. My family and I reside in Moses Lake, Washington.
2. My family and I were scheduled for an Individual Hearing on my asylum application on May 10, 2017. My attorney, William Frick informed me that several days prior to May 10 he received a telephone call from the Immigration Court informing him that the May 10, 2017 hearing would be postponed because Immigration Judge Walsh was required to work on other more urgent matters in Tacoma on that date.
3. On the Friday before the hearing, I had not received anything in writing from the Immigration Court. I called the Immigration Court information service and found that the recorded information stated that the May 10, 2017 hearing was still scheduled. I called my attorney and told him this. He seemed surprised and he told me that sometimes the information in the immigration agencies' databases is not quickly updated. He was concerned and told me that he would find out about the hearing.
4. On Monday May 8, William Frick told me that he had left a voicemail with the Immigration Court asking for clarification on the hearing date.
5. The next day, Tuesday May 9, William Frick telephoned me to say that he had spoken personally with the Immigration Court and that the Court told him that the hearing was postponed, and that we would receive an order in the mail for a new date that would be about a year away.
6. Based upon what my attorney told me, neither I nor my family drove to Seattle or went to the Immigration Court on May 10, 2017.
7. The only reason that we did not attend is that our attorney assured us that the hearing was postponed due to the Immigration Court's schedule.
8. I think that my attorney made an honest mistake in misinforming me about the postponement. I think that my attorney honestly believed that the hearing had been postponed.

**STATEMENT OF FACTS**

Jagjit Singh is 43 years old. He was born in Urapar, Inda and is a citizen of India.

Jagjit Singh has also been known as Jaswant Singh.

Mr. Singh completed his education in India, obtaining a Bachelor degree in Commerce from Guru Nanak Dev University.

Mr. Singh is Sikh and continues to practice Sikhism.

Ravinder Kaur is 44 years old. She is wife to Jagjit Singh; they were married on November 24, 1998 in Chakdana, India. Ravinder was born in Majhoor, India, and is a citizen of India.

Jagjit and Ravinder have two daughters: Amardip Kaur, born on November 8, 1999 in Chak Dana, India; she is a citizen of India; *and* Hargun Kaur, born February 18, 2010, born in Rome, Italy.

Respondents currently reside at 4312 Sun Drive NE, Moses Lake, Washington 98837-3534.

Jagjit Singh is employed as a truck driver.

Ravinder Kaur is a homemaker and cares for their two young daughters.

Jagjit Singh and his family arrived in the United States at New York with a B-2 visitor visas on April 5, 2013 (expiration 10/04/2013).

Before entering the United States this family resided in Rome, Italy. Mr. Singh worked as an ice cream maker in Italy.

1 While residing in India, Mr. Jagjit Singh became a member of the Shiromani  
2 Akali Dal a/k/a Mann Party in 1992. As a member of the Mann Party, Mr. Singh enrolled  
3 new members for the Party.

4 On June 20, 1993, four India policemen came to this family home, forcefully  
5 removing Mr. Jagjit Singh from his home, taking him to the police station and detaining  
6 him. The police advised Mr. Singh that the purpose of their detention of him was his  
7 membership and activities related to the Mann Party.

8 While detained on June 20, 1993, Mr. Singh was blind-folded and beaten. He was  
9 then tied with a rope, hung upside down and tortured on his feet, legs and backs with  
10 "sticks". During this beating, the police officers told Mr. Singh, "you want Khalistan?  
11 You like Mann group? You have your demands? Now, it's my duty to give you  
12 everything!" The India police also burned Mr. Singh on his feet and legs. They  
13 continued to beat him until he lost conscious.

14 Mr. Singh reports that when he awakened on June 25, 1993, he was in a hospital  
15 where he was treated and discharged on July 10, 1993.

16 Amrik Singh, Mr. Singh's father, paid Rs. 2,000,000 for his son's release from the  
17 India police station and then took his son to the hospital.

18 After his release from the hospital, Jagjit Singh met with Simranjit Singh Mann  
19 regarding this police detention and brutal beating.

20 In January 1994, while Mr. Singh was at the local market, India police came to his  
21 parent's home, seeking his whereabouts. The police threatened his father and threatened  
22 harm to Jagjit and their family because of his involvement with the Mann Party.  
23  
24  
25

1 After this second home visit to Mr. Singh's family, he left the home and lived  
2 with various relatives in different towns in India, seeking safety from the India police.

3 In May 1996, he moved to the state of Gujarat, India, where he worked as a  
4 storekeeper for *T.S. Pabla & Sons*, a civil mechanical contractor.

5 In March 1998, Mr. Singh's neighbor, Amarjit Singh, advised Jagjit that while he  
6 was at work India police came to his home. When the police found that Jagjit was not  
7 home, they proceeded to ask neighbors of Jagjit's whereabouts. On hearing this, Jagjit  
8 fled his employment and his home, leaving everything behind, and returned to Punjab.  
9 He continued to receive police threats and had difficulty living and staying in one place.

10 On November 24, 1998, Jagjit Singh married Ravinder Kaur in V.P.O. Chak  
11 Dana, The. & Distt. Nawanshahr, Punjab, India.

12 Their first daughter, Amardip Kaur, was born on November 8, 1999 in Chak  
13 Dana, India.

14 In March 2000, Jagjit fled to Italy, having a work permit to work there. He did  
15 this in hopes of finding safety.

16 On December 10, 2006, with his wife still in India, the police came to their family  
17 home and arrested his wife, interrogating her about the whereabouts of Jagjit Singh.

18 On March 20, 2008, the India police came, again, to the family home, asking  
19 Ravinder Kaur the whereabouts of her husband. On this visit, she reported to the police  
20 that Jagjit Singh was now living in Italy. They verbally harassed her, telling her they did  
21 not believe her, accused her of lying, and threatened to "lock me in a jail cell". Finally,  
22 the police left.  
23  
24  
25

1 The harassment by the India police continued against his wife, Ravinder Kaur; his  
2 parents; and his brother, Gurdev Singh.

3 Between 2000 to 2009, Mr. Singh would travel back and forth between Italy and  
4 India, hoping that he could return and live safely and peaceably with his family.  
5 Unfortunately, he was not able and he finally had had enough and moved his wife and  
6 daughter to Rome, Italy. Mr. Singh still had a work permit for Italy.

7 On January 23, 2009, Ravinder Kaur moved to Italy with their oldest daughter,  
8 Amardip Kaur.

9 On September 1, 2009, Amardip Kaur was issued an India passport.

10 On February 18, 2010, Mr. Singh and Ms. Kaur's second daughter, Hargun Kaur,  
11 was born in Rome, Italy.

12 On December 8, 2010, Mr. Singh came to the United States on a B-2 visitor visa  
13 to visit a family friend in Boston, Massachusetts; he returned to Italy on December 21,  
14 2010.

15 On January 27, 2011, Ravinder Kaur returned to India to re-establish their home  
16 in hopes of the family safely returning to India.

17 On May 11, 2011, Ravinder Kaur returned to Italy with their two daughters. The  
18 police had come to the family home in India, looking for Jagjit Singh, again threatening  
19 Ms. Kaur with harm.

20 On October 25, 2011, Ms. Kaur returned to India and tried to establish a family  
21 home for them closer to her family.  
22  
23  
24  
25

1 Unfortunately, on June 2, 2012, Ms. Kaur and their daughters were forced to  
2 leave India and return to Rome, Italy, due to continued harassment.

3 This going back and forth between India and Italy was difficult on this family.  
4 Jagjit and Ravinder wanted to raise their daughters near their grandparents and extended  
5 family. Eventually, they tried one more time and Ravinder and their two daughters  
6 returned to India on July 21, 2012, to try and settle their family in India. She lived with  
7 various family members, but found this still to be unsafe as India police continued to  
8 harass her.

9 On April 5, 2013, Mr. Singh, his wife, and two daughters arrived in the United  
10 States with B-2 visitor visas.

11 Mr. Singh has made efforts to safely return to India, but each time has been  
12 harassed and threatened by India police; they have also harassed and threatened his wife  
13 and father and brother.

**1. JAGJIT SINGH**

Respondent is expected to testify regarding his Application for Asylum and for Withholding of Removal and protection under the Convention Against Torture. He will also testify regarding the evidence submitted in support of his application for asylum.

**2. RAVINDER KAUR**

Respondent is expected to testify regarding her Application for Asylum and for Withholding of Removal and protection under the Convention Against Torture. She will also testify regarding the evidence submitted in support of her application for asylum.

**ESTIMATED TIME REQUIRED TO PRESENT RESPONDENT'S CASE**

Respondent anticipates approximately two (2) hours to present his case at the Individual Hearing.

Additionally, Respondent requests the presence of a Punjab translator at this hearing.

**LEGAL ARGUMENT**

There are two distinct paths to humanitarian asylum. An applicant who suffered only the "normal" amount of past persecution *remains eligible* for asylum in the absence of a well-founded fear, if there is a reasonable possibility that he or she will suffer other serious harm upon removal. *See Chieh v. Holder*, 411 F.App'x 800, 803 (6<sup>th</sup> Cir. 2011).

Humanitarian asylum is a form of relief, which is a viable form of relief where an alien's severe past persecution has had long-term effects or wherein the alien suffered

1 other "serious" harm not on account of his or her race, religion, nationality, membership in  
2 a particular social group or political opinion.

3 Respondents in this matter suffered at the hands of opposition political party  
4 members, and a corrupt India police department, who refused to help and protect  
5 Respondent – all because of the *possibility* he supported and promoted/political  
6 democratic process and social justice for the Sikh community.

7 Respondents fled India to avoid further beatings, torture and harassment by the  
8 India Police, and their inability to secure safety from the India police and government for  
9 simply having strong political views and religious commitment to Sikhism, and basic  
10 human rights of the Sikh community.

11 Where an alien has demonstrated that he or she has suffered past persecution and  
12 Department of Homeland Security (DHS) has rebutted the presumption of future  
13 persecution, an alien can still be granted asylum:

- 14 1. Where he demonstrates compelling reasons for being unwilling or unable  
15 to return to the designated country based on the severity of the past  
16 persecution; or
- 17 2. Where he demonstrates the reasonable possibility that he will suffer other  
18 serious harm if he is removed to the designated country.  
19

20 In *Matter of Chen*, 20 I. & N. Dec. 16 (B.I.A. 1989), the BIA referred to the  
21 "general humanitarian principle" in paragraph 136 of the UNHCR Handbook on  
22 Procedures and Criteria for Determining Refugee Status under the 1951 Convention and  
23 the 1967 Protocol Relating to the Status of Refugees. The BIA found that the alien had  
24

1 suffered severe past persecution, including physical and mental abuse, during the Chinese  
2 Cultural Revolution on *account of his family* and their strong religious beliefs, but did not  
3 have a well-founded fear of future persecution. The BIA, however, granted asylum based  
4 on the *severity* of the alien's past persecution in the exercise of its discretion.

5 Respondents have also been victims of brutal persecution – at the hands of the  
6 India police – and have been unable to secure the safety with the India police and  
7 government authorities - a public service wherein a community is supposed to trust for  
8 safety and protection. While the attorney general has discretion to grant asylum to  
9 petitioners who have “suffered under atrocious forms of persecution, even where there is  
10 little likelihood of future persecution”, *Ben Hamida v. Gonzales*, 478 F.3d 734, 740 (6<sup>th</sup>  
11 Cir. 2007) (quoting *Matter of Chen*, 20 I&N Dec. 16, 19 (1989)).

12 Respondents have a pending application for asylum and for withholding of  
13 removal, wherein they belong to a social and political group at issue, and where Mr. Jagjit  
14 Singh's membership to his Sikh religion, and his political stance for democracy and social  
15 justice are at issue in this matter. See *Matter of Acosta*, 19 I&N Dec. 211 (BIA 1985),  
16 which held that the common characteristic for membership in a particular social group for  
17 asylum should be one that the *members of the group* cannot change, or should not be  
18 required to change because it is fundamental to identity or conscience. In *Matter of C-A*,  
19 23 I&N Dec. 951, it found that an important consideration is the “social visibility” of the  
20 members of the particular group. In addition, *Matter of S-E-G*, 24 I&N Dec. 579 (BIA  
21 2007), the Board of Immigration Appeals required that the group must be “particular” –  
22 that is, distinct and recognizable in the society. Respondent, if returned to India, would  
23  
24  
25

1 suffer further persecution and torture by the same political and governmental force – a  
2 decision that would jeopardize the Respondent’s life and possibly his family.

3 Respondents have met the threshold for a grant of asylum. Mr. Jagjit Singh tried  
4 to uphold his religious and political values in India, in a peaceful manner, instead, was  
5 beaten and tortured. If Respondents are returned to India, they will more likely than not  
6 be further tortured and/or killed.

7 **CONCLUSION AND REQUEST FOR RELIEF**

8 Considering the totality of the evidence presented by Respondent, the Respondent  
9 respectfully requests the Court:

- 10 1. Warrant a favorable exercise of discretion and grant Respondent asylum,  
11 and cancellation of removal pursuant to Section 240A(a) of the Immigration  
12 and Nationality Act (INA); or  
13  
14 2. Terminate these removal proceedings and order this matter transferred to the  
15 U.S. Citizenship & Immigration Services (USCIS) for review, consideration  
16 and decision of the Respondent’s I-589, Application for Asylum and for  
17 Withholding of Removal.

18 WHEREFORE, the Respondents respectfully requests that this Court grant the  
19 Respondents asylum and withholding of removal.

However, there were unscrupulous elements in the State forces, who exploited the situation. They would take any body in custody on the false charge of being a member of extremist group, beat and torture him by third degree methods, threaten him about his life and liberty and even threaten their kith and kins about the safety of their wards/family members, extort money from them and only then release him.
5. That my son Jagjit Singh was also picked up from my house on the evening of 20 June 1993 when 4 persons in uniforms came to my house and caught hold of my above named son, took him to the Nawanshahr police station saying that they are to interrogate him about some happenings in the area. The police did not disclose anything about the whereabouts of my son inspite of my running from pillar to post. Then I approached Mr. Daljit Singh Sarpanch (Elected Headman of our village), who was known for his anti Khalistan Stance in the area and therefore had good rapport with the administrative machinery to help me, who then accompanied me to the police officials. My son was located but his condition was almost that of a dead person. He had been tortured to such an extent that he had lost almost all his senses. Even inspite of intervention of above Mr. Daljit Singh, I was made to part with a sum of Rs. 2,00,000/- to save my son, which I arranged from my relatives and friends. Then I got my son admitted to Little Flower Institute of Para Medical Science & Hospital Nawanshahr where my son remained under



treatment for about a fortnight after which I brought him home.

6. That after about six months of the above happening, one day when my son was not at home, the police personnel again came to my house and started asking about the whereabouts of my son Jagjit Singh. Thus my son escaped arrest. He then started staying away from home with different relations for short durations. In the year 1996 my son Jagjit Singh went to a distant relation in Gujrat and started working there. However the police continued to track my son. One day in March 1998 people of Gujrat police came to the house of my son when he was away. My son, who was informed about this when he returned home, got panicky and returned to Punjab. In between the intervening period we arranged a very simple marriage of my son.
7. That my son Jagjit Singh, to save himself from future problems, arranged a work permit and went to Italy leaving his wife at home. However the police continued to make visit to my house asking for the whereabouts of Jagjit Singh. They even took his wife Ravinder Kaur and my younger son Gurdev Singh to the police station in the year 2006 maintaining that they are to make certain questioning both of them were released with great difficulty but before Gurdev Singh my younger son was also physically beaten and tortured. Jagjit Singh then took his family to Italy in the year 2009.
8. That due to high-handedness of the police with Jagjit Singh and their continued surveillance of our house have made my family members very apprehensive about their safety My younger son Gurdev Singh due to torture given to him has developed a fear psychosis and gone under depression in the year 2007 and he is undergoing medical treatment for the last almost 7 years from Dr. Navinder Monga MBBS, MD (psychiatry) of Mind Care Centre Ludhiana.
9. That as the movement for a separate state of khalistan still continues, through presently at a low ebb, yet the police are keeping a close watch and the persons with previous history of participation in the movement are their special lock-outs. Thus I have every reason to apprehend danger to life & liberty of Jagjit Singh here in India.

However in the middle of June 1994 he was picked up by security forces on the charge of being a sympathizer of the extremist group, subjected to lot of physical atrocities and released after four/five days after intervention of the village headman (Sarpanch) Mr. Daljit Singh who was persuaded by Mr. Amrik Singh -his father- and the neighbors including the deponent to intervene to save his son.
5. That after release from the police custody, Mr. Jagjit Singh remained under treatment for some time, then left for another Indian State, returned to Punjab after sometime, got married but did not stay at village for much time. He then went abroad.

## **DECLARATION OF JAGJIT SINGH**

I, JAGJIT SINGH, declare under penalty of perjury according to the laws of the State of Washington that the following is true and correct:

1. I am over the age of 18 years, am competent to testify in a court of law, and voluntarily provide this statement from my own personal knowledge and recollection.
2. I was born on May 3, 1974 in Urapar, India.
3. I completed my education in India and have a Bachelor of Commerce from Guru Nanak Dev University.
4. I am married to Ravinder Kaur. We married on November 24, 1998.
5. I am Sikh. I practice my Sikh religion, but I do not have freedom in India to practice and live my religion.
6. I am a member of the Mann group, which represents the Sikh community for peaceful social, ethnic and religious justice. The mission of the Mann group is to achieve *Khalistan*, which means achievement of a separate homeland for Sikhs in India, through a peaceful process.
7. As a member of the Mann group, I helped by enrolling new members for the promotion of *Khalistan*. As a member, I was harassed and persecuted by members of the India government.
8. On June 20, 1993, four India policemen, in khaki uniform, came to my home. They forcefully took me to the police station, where they locked me in a jail cell. Approximately two hours later, they came to my cell and wrapped my eyes with a cloth and started hitting me very crudely. They

then tied me with a rope and suspended me upside down from the ceiling. They beat me on my feet, legs and back with sticks. One police officer was yelling at me – “you want Khalistan? You like Mann group? You have your demands? Now, it’s my duty to give you everything!” They also burned me on my feet and legs. Eventually, they beat me until I became unconscious.

9. When I woke up, I was in the hospital. My whole body was very painful. My feet felt like they were not part of me. I was treated and released from the hospital on July 10, 1993. I was in the hospital from June 25, 1993 through July 10, 1993.
10. My father, Amrik Singh, told me that he and the mayor of my village, Daljit Singh, went to the police station and negotiated my release by paying Rs. 2,00,000.
11. After my release from the hospital and when I was feeling better, I spoke with Simranjit Singh Mann about my arrest and torture. Mr. Mann told me that if it was not for my father and the mayor, I likely would have been killed by the India police.
12. In approximately January 1994, I was in the market. While I was at the market, the India police came to my home, again, and began asking my father questions about. The police made threats to my father to cause harm to me, and my family. So, I had to leave my home and family in order to escape and also to protect my family.

13. From 1994 until approximately 1996, I lived with various relatives in different towns because I was not safe anywhere; the India police were looking for me and making continued threats to my family in an effort to find me.
14. In May 1996, I went to Gujarat, India in an effort to relocate and find safety for myself. I worked as a storekeeper for *T.S. Pabla & Sons*, a civil mechanical contractor.
15. One day, in approximately March 1998, my neighbor, Amarjit Singh, told me that when I was at work, policeman came to my house; when no one answered the door they started asking neighbors where they could find me. When I received this information, I immediately left my job and all of my belongings and returned to Punjab. I lived in various places in Punjab. I had a lot of difficulty living in one place because of the India police and their threats.
16. In approximately March 2000, I went to Italy on a work permit. I did this in hopes of finding safety. During this time, the India police continued to come to my family's home asking where I was living.
17. In 2006, the India police took my wife to the police station, where they asked her questions about me. This was very stressful to her.
18. The India police not only harassed my wife and parents, but also my brother, Gurdev Singh. He is being treated for depression in Ludhiana, India by Dr. Navinder Monga, M.B.B.S., M.D., psychiatrist.

19. I continued to live in Italy. I tried to return to India, but when I did the India police came to my family's home looking for me. I was not able to live with them because of fear of harm to them and to me.
20. In 2009, I moved my wife and children to Rome, Italy. I had employment in Rome and a valid work permit. As long as I had a job, my work permit was valid.
21. On December 8, 2010, I came to the United States on a B-2 Visitor Visa. I returned to Italy on December 21, 2010.
22. I arrived in the United States with my family on April 5, 2013 on a B-2 Visitor Visa.
23. I cannot return to India. I fear I will be arrested again by the India police and the next time they will kill me, as Simranjit Singh Mann has told me, as the India police have told my parents and wife, and as many other Sikhs and members of the Mann party have been killed. I have tried to relocate within India, but this has not been successful.
24. I cannot return to India and put myself, my wife and/or my children at such risk of harm.

## DECLARATION OF RAVINDER KAUR

I, RAVINDER KAUR, declare under penalty of perjury according to the laws of the State of Washington that the following is true and correct:

1. I am over the age of 18 years, am competent to testify in a court of law, and voluntarily provide this statement from my own personal knowledge and recollection.
2. I was born on May 13, 1973 in Majhooor, India.
3. I am married to Jagjit Singh. We married November 24, 1998.
4. I completed my education in Punjab, India.
5. Jagjit and I have been married for 15 years, but we have been unable to live peacefully because of my husband's membership in the Mann group.
6. Shortly after we were married, we were forced to live in various towns with different relatives because the India police were always looking for my husband because of his membership.
7. On several occasions, the India police would come to the house where we were living and ask me where my husband was, if he was home, and questioned me and threatened me.
8. On December 10, 2006, the India police came to the home we were living and took me to the police station. They asked me many questions about my husband; they kept me at the police station until evening time.
9. On March 20, 2008, the police came to our house, again, looking for my husband. I told them that he was not home that he was in Italy. They did


not believe me. They told me I was lying and threatened to lock me in a jail cell. They finally left our home.

10. On January 23, 2009, I moved to Italy with our oldest daughter, Amardip Kaur, where my husband was living. While in Rome, Italy, I gave birth to our second daughter, Hargun Kaur.
11. On January 27, 2011, I returned to India in hopes of establishing a safe home for my husband, daughters and me.
12. On May 11, 2011, I returned to Italy with our daughters. The India police again, threatened me; they told me they were looking for my husband.
13. On October 25, 2011, I returned to Italy. This time, I tried to establish a home near my family.
14. I was forced to leave India, again, on June 2, 2012, and returned to my husband in Rome, Italy.
15. My husband and I talked very seriously. We missed our family and our culture. We wanted to raise our daughters near their grandparents and our families. So, I returned to India on July 21, 2012, in an effort and hopeful that I could find a place for us to settle. I made every effort to find a safe place for us to live, but continued to be threatened and harassed by India police. I lived in many places with different family members, but this was not safe.
16. My husband and I have tried to establish our home and family in India, but we have continued to be threatened by the India police. My husband has

been arrested and tortured by the India police because of his membership with the Mann group.

17. On April 5, 2013, I came to the United States with my husband and our two daughters. We cannot return to India. It is not safe for us to live there because of my husband's membership in the Mann party. This is difficult for us. We miss our parents and other family.
18. I cannot return to India for fear of torture and further harm to our two daughters, my husband and myself.
